

From the Pastor:



LCMS News



Rev. Dr. Matthew C. Harrison was re-elected to his fifth term as Synod President in an online vote of LCMS congregations taken on June 17-18. Rev. Harrison has held this position since 2010. Four other names were present on the ballot. Out of 6,053 congre-

gational voters, a total of 5,000 votes were cast. The votes tallied were:

Rev. Matthew C. Harrison– 2,616 (52.32%) Rev. Patrick T. Ferry– 1,593 (31.86%) Rev. Benjamin T. Ball– 341 (6.82%) Rev. Richard Snow– 318 (6.36%) Rev. Peter K. Lange– 132 (2.64%)

President Harrison will preside over the upcoming Synod Convention to take place in Milwaukee, WI from July 29-August 3. Pastor Sorenson will be representing our Madison North Circuit churches as the pastoral delegate.

The theme of the Convention is "We Preach Christ Crucified" (1 Corinthians 2:2). Please pray for all the delegates and our Synod as we seek to build up a greater unity and answer the difficult challenges to the Church.
