

From the Pastor:

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

It was a very humbling experience for me to attend our Synod Convention. I have always enjoyed going to events where the church gathers in mass because it gives me a different perspective of the Church. So often, we focus so closely on our own congregation or maybe the few that exist around us. While we all know or understand that there are other churches and other Christians out there besides us, it's not until we see the fuller crowd of believers that the reality truly hits us.

The theme of our Synod Convention was "We Preach Christ Crucified" (1 Corinthians 1:23). In this verse, all of Christianity, all doctrine and teaching, and all manner of life is boiled down to one point. For this is the message that shall draw all our churches together... and not just our own, but people from every tribe and nation and language. "We" collectively have such a wonderful and powerful message to share so that we "preach". We "preach" to the world, sharing our faith with all to hear that they may know "Christ", the God-man who took upon himself our flesh and sin and was "Crucified" for us!

This is the message that not only saves us but unites us with one another. Upon this confession, we are bound together in faith and Christian love. For it binds us not just here in the USA, but across the world. At this convention, we had the distinct joy to recognize fellowship with four new Lutheran Church bodies from across the globe, namely, The Evangelical Lutheran Church of South Sudan and Sudan (ELCSS/S), the Evangelical Lutheran Mission Diocese of Finland (ELMDF), the Lutheran Church of Uganda (LCU), and the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ukraine (ELCU).

Yes, it was truly humbling to be a part of recognizing and experiencing the strong bond of faith and the far-reaching connections we have as the LCMS. For this was but a glimpse of the views we shall have on the last day before the throne of God, as Revelation records (Revelation 7:9). When all those who trust in Christ Crucified shall gather together and sing an eternal song, there shall be no more confusion about how "successful" the Church has been.

For let this be our encouragement in the faith. Our confession of Christ and him Crucified shall be the foundation upon which the Church endures throughout all time. It shall be the confession which joins in Christian love and charity people from all tribes, nations, languages and times to be the Holy Christian Church on earth. This confession shall be our salvation by which Christ brings us into eternal paradise! Let us preach Christ Crucified, folly to the world, but the very power of God unto salvation for all who believe!
