

From the Pastor:

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

You know what they always say about March. It comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb. March is a hopeful month where we all look forward to the warmer temperatures, sunnier days, and the disappearance of snow. Say what you will about your favorite season, but there's no doubt that we all love spring and the changes it brings.

In the same way, we progress through our Church year. There's really no better analogy of the major change we experience than with the changing seasons. We begin March still in the depths of Lent. Our focus is on our mourning over sin and seeing how much chaos and darkness it brings into our life. We know that life is unpredictable. It's a rollercoaster of the ups and downs we experience.

The key to enduring both of these seasons is hope. In winter, we have hope that it will eventually give way to spring. In Lent, we have hope that Easter is just around the corner. Lent is so much more than a penitential season. It's penitential for sure, but for the purpose of pushing us back onto the hope that we have. Lent seeks to strip away all the crutches we've gathered for ourselves, all the false supports we've built up, so that we can lean on the only one we need. We must hold onto hope... hope that things will be better, hope that change is on the horizon, hope in Christ.

We will certainly come into this month like a lion. We'll hear the devil roar and taunt us. He'll do all he can to keep us in the dark. But this is the month where we go to the darkest day. We go where the sun is hidden and death reigns. We'll go to the cross of Jesus. Yet, it's there where we will say, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" John 1:29. Behold the Lamb! The Lamb who quiets all our fears. The Lamb who silences the lion. The Lamb who has paid for all our sins and lives victoriously over death! From the darkness of death, the Lamb of God shall lead us forth to brighter and better days. Alleluia!


Matching Funds Offering




